

Forgiveness

Being forgiven + forgiving others – feelings before + after, easy or hard to forgive?

Forgiving others is an essential aspect of Christian ethics. Christians believe that to forgive is to reflect the loving nature of God and his reaction to human beings.

Luke 7: The 2 debtors + Matthew 18: The unforgiving servant – parables showing the relation between the level of love and the level of forgiveness.



'Father, forgive them; for they know not what they do,' spoken by Jesus at crucifixion.

Justice + fairness

Christian agencies that help others: Christian Aid, Salvation Army, Samaritan's Purse – helping to support people getting support they need + deserve.

Papa Panov – Russian story of Christmas including the words of Christ in a vision, 'whatever you did for one of the least of these, you did for me'. Compare to Matthew 25 – The sheep + the goats: includes quote as above. Both stories teach how Christians believe we should treat each other.
